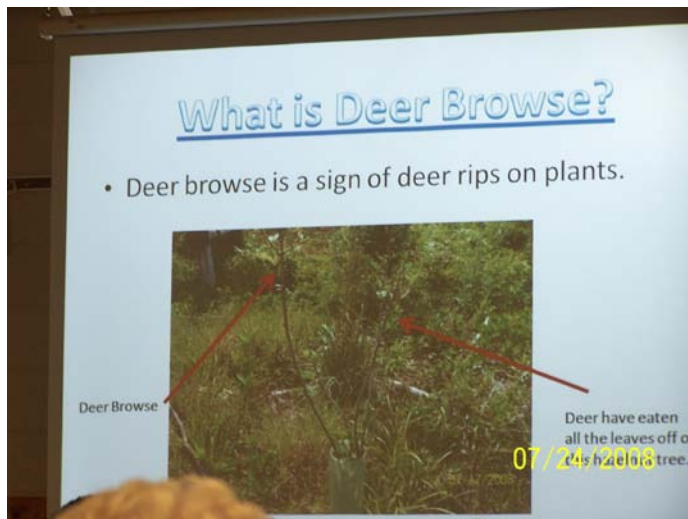
## Maryland Summer Centers for Gifted and Talented Students
